<u>Proposed Change</u>: To the current electives, please add the following two new courses as electives for the Japanese minor.

JAPA360: Topics in Japanese Popular Culture: Introduction to Anime and Manga Studies

JAPA370: Video Games and Japan

<u>Justification</u>: Both JAPA360 and JAPA370 are new courses; JAPA360 was first offered in Fall 2016, and JAPA370 was first offered in Spring 2017. The student enrollments in these courses have been very high: JAPA360 (31 in Fall 2016, 26 in Fall 2017) and JAPA370 (25 in Spring 2017). Currently neither course is listed as a Japanese minor elective, and I request them to be included in the list.
