Because many of the courses that fulfill the requirements for the Immigration Studies Minor are not taught regularly (every three or four semesters or more), the addition of these courses from different disciplines will help alleviate the shortage of courses for the minor and reduce the number of course substitutions.

The Sociology program voted during our November meeting to approve the following courses to be added to the Immigration Studies Minor: INTS 417, INTS 437, INTS 438, SOCI 394. We request that these courses be approved to fulfill the requirements for the minor.

INTS 417 (Human Trafficking) will fulfill the "Global Perspectives on Migration and Ethnicity" requirement.

INTS 437 (Critical Race Studies) will fulfill the "Electives" requirement.

INTS 438 (Representations of Race) will fulfill the "Electives" requirement.

SOCI 394 (Sociology of Human Rights) will fulfill the "Global Perspectives on Migration and Ethnicity" requirement.
